I. Title: Source apportionment of black carbon aerosols from India and China

Description: In a preliminary study we demonstrated the large potential of microscale ¹⁴C dating to constrain what sources dominate BC from wintertime India (Brown Clouds over South Asia: Biomass or fossil fuel combustion?, Science, 23 Jan. 2009).

Carbon membranes from unburned carbon in fly ash for environmental applications

Description: Unburned carbon present in biomass (bagasse) fly ash was found to be a suitable precursor for obtaining activated carbon having a combination of meso and micropores, in the planning grant study carried out by the applicants in 2007. In addition, the oxide constituent in fly ash has been used for developing membrane supports by the Indian partner.
